Planning & Programing

Five Year State

Transportation Plan (2019-2023)



- ▶ **Proposed projects have been submitted**
- ▶ **P2P process is being implemented with the District meetings occurring over the next couple of weeks**
- ▶ **Planning Level Scoping team and criteria are being assembled and developed**
- ▶ **Decision Lens – Will be utilized to gauge changes in performance metrics.**

Planning & Studies



Arizona State Freight Plan

- ▶ **FAST Act requires a State Freight Plan every five years.**
- ▶ **Freight funding appropriation to the State for FY 2016-2020 averages near \$20 million per year.**
- ▶ **The plan defines the Critical Freight Corridors for both Rural and Urban highways. The Rural Corridors occur throughout Greater Arizona Regions while the Urban Corridors are mostly defined within the MAG & PAG regions.**
- ▶ **The plan provides recommendations for projects utilizing the Freight Funding.**
- ▶ **The final draft of the plan was submitted to FHWA at the end of September, and will be presented to the Board in October.**

Multimodal Planning Division Report

Transit Group



- ▶ **Certification of Transit Oversight Program**
- ▶ **5310 – Seniors and Disabled, Currently distributing scope of work to each of the agencies, contracts to be executed, with funds available October 1, 2017**
- ▶ **5311 – Two year program, with year 2 just starting**
- ▶ **Transit Planning Grants, due October 26th. (COG/MPO)**

Status of Groups



Research

- ▶ Continues to work on minimizing research project time frames.
- ▶ Initiating new measures to streamline and expedite evaluation of products for the Approved Product List.

Data Management

- ▶ Continuing to collect mobile data for HPMS
- ▶ Initiating pilot project using LIDAR to map existing roadway surface and features for use in design projects.
